Mr. Amit Kumar, Asst. Prof., P.G. Department of History, SSM College, Dinanagar inaugurated the webinar and outlined the theme of the webinar. After that Principal Dr. R. K. Tuli, welcomed the dignitaries and introduced them with the participants.

Dr. Veena Sachdeva (Former President of Department of History, Punjab University Chandigarh) started her discourse by discussing about the role of intermediary Zamidars housed to collect land Revenue from the Primary Zamidars (cultivators) and gave it to the Government. Early medieval Indian economy, polity, society, and religion became more and more linked and depended on the land and its resources. Zamidars were serving the state as an intermediary so they get reward for that from the government in the form of land and they get tax exemption by the government for their own land. She discussed her course with the help of a Power point presentation. She elaborated Doaba area of Punjaband the Zamidari system and system of land revenue collection. **Dr. Radha Sharma** (Former Head, Department of History and Dean Faculty of Arts and social Sciences, GNDU Amritsar) discussed the Transition in Property Rights from early 19th century to modern times and also about the state of Punjab in early 19th Century. She also elaborated her topic through the power point presentation. **Dr. Harish Sharma** (Former Head, Department of History and Women Rights in the colonial Punjab.

In the end of the Webinar Asst. Prof Amit Kumar, thanked the Resource Persons and participants for making the webinars a great success.


